## Consultation at every stage

Southern NSW Local Health District and Health Infrastructure have undertaken extensive rounds of consultation regarding this project at every step of the way.

More than 1500 people made of up staff and community groups have been consulted as part of the redevelopment process.

Most recently there have been 15 Project User Groups (PUG) comprised of nurses, medical officers and other health professionals to help with the consultation of the schematic design. An average of 220 staff and patients participated over two months in each of the three rounds of the PUGs that contributed to these designs.

Southern NSW Local Health District and Health Infrastructure have drawn on the experience and expertise within its Community Consultation Committee, who have provided further consumer perspectives on the future needs of the redevelopment.
